

"A VISION OF GOD IN THEIR HOURS OF DIFFICULTY" (Incarceration)

One of the Primary Missions of House of Hope Ministry is to **Reach Out** in **Love** and **Truth** to **Prisoners**, helping each inmate catch the Vision of God. At times we succeed but other times we do not! We pray for 100% success but this high success rate is rare! Every life matters. Every prisoner is important to us. Every inmate family is equally a priority. **We treasure every man or woman we work with in jail**, but at times this is not how the Ministry begins with certain inmates. Allow me to give you an example:

...an inmate wrote: "I loved my mother and showed her how much. I loved her by coming to this Hell Hole! Now she has to take the trouble and travel expense and time off from her job to come up here and visit me in prison. She's the only true friend I've got now." The many, and I do mean many men I have met in the past 25+ years were this way in the beginning. I would start to see a change over a period of months or years of ministering. There were times when I would nearly give up on an inmate in jail. But the Lord showed me the need ... "to stay the course" with an individual "to keep speaking to him and praying for him."

So many times over the years, I nearly gave up on a man, but **God showed up**. The next meeting I would see the same individual, but he seemed to be radically changed. I still marvel, thinking **this cannot be the same prisoner!** 

I was witnessing another miracle of God. Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. Romans 12:12

The majority of prisoners have experienced a life full of disappointments, failure, resentment, fears, guilt, and very little to give them hope for a better life.

What do you say to such people about a God who is loving & caring; and how do you explain the Savior's love and mercy which offers a new life to a prisoner who has never experienced Him?

What does a prisoner see in you to make them believe we're different from all the other users or abusers they believed and trusted in the past?

### We bring Hope in – His name is Jesus!


A volunteer said to me that "I was bringing the face and hands of Jesus to the prisoners." He had paid me one of the greatest compliments which encouraged me in my faith.

#### **REALLY, THAT'S ALL WE DO!**

How much does God love a Prisoner's soul or their family? What's their worth?

Nearly 2,000 years ago, Jesus spoke those words and they still ring true in 2015, "For such a time as this!!"
